

Local company headed to the Olympics

A Wisconsin company is headed to the Olympics.

Kobussen Buses, Ltd. is sending 5 motor coaches and 10 drivers all the way to Vancouver, to help bring Olympic spectators from the city to the mountain where the events are held.

The Kobussen Buses left at 5 a.m. Saturday to travel across country two thousand miles before crossing the border into Canada. The border crossing will take approximately a day to make sure all paper work and security checks are completed on the drivers and the buses.

This is an incredible honor, to be part of such a huge event, so far away. Kobussen Buses, Ltd. has been planning for this trip for over six months, which included terrorism training and safety inspections.
